SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Homily FR. JOEL JASON on the Gospel: Matthew 13:44-52 *The Parable of the Hidden Treasure*

Excerpts...

THERE is a reason you are here. You are here because you are looking for something. You are here because there is a treasure that you see worthy of pursuing every time you attend our Feast gathering.

And that's our Gospel today is talking about.

The Gospel talks about people who are searching for true riches. And in the Gospel, Jesus compares the Kingdom of God to a treasure hidden in a field that a man accidentally finds and he sells everything that he had to purchase the land and to own the treasure.

In the next parable, Jesus says the Kingdom of God is like a man searching for fine pearls and when he finds one pearl of great value, he gives away everything that he has to obtain the fine pearl, the pearl of great prize.



Who Is Poor? Who Is Rich?

Our Gospel reminds us that we are searching for riches and that we may find real wealth.

When is it said that one looks wealthy? When the person is well-dressed, stands tall, has smooth skin.

Sometimes, if you have no money, but you pretend to be wealthy, you eventually look well off.

But who is really wealthy? There are those who are actually rich but are actually poor. They have everything but they are actually poor.

And for this morning, this is what I would like us to reflect upon. When do we become really poor? The *poor* I refer to here is not the pitiful indigent-- *hindi lang yung mahirap, ang ibig sabihin ay yung kaawa awa.* It is possible that you are rich yet you are poor. *Yung mayaman ka pero kaawa awa ka parin sa paningin ng Panginoon.*

So, when does that happen? I propose three signs that indicate one is really poor.

SIGNS YOU ARE POOR

1. You Have Wealth but No Wisdom

Our First Reading is very beautiful. It is the story of Solomon.

And who is Solomon? He is the Son of David. So, he is set to begin his kingship.

But God appears to him in a dream—maybe in his prayer time.

And then God says, "Solomon, ask whatever it is that you want and I will give it to you."

Wow! It's like God is giving you a blank check—He already signed.

If the Lord appears to you and says the same favor He has given to Solomon, what will you ask the Lord?

What does Solomon say? "Give me wisdom." The ability to *distinguish evil from good*. And the Reading says that God is so pleased by Solomon's request that He gives him wisdom beyond compare. Solomon becomes the wisest man in the world that no other man may be compared with him.

And God gives him riches beyond any wealth in the world. Solomon receives not just wisdom but wealth as well.

How You Become Rich

Ask for wisdom. Why? Because without wisdom, you wouldn't know what to do with your wealth. Without wisdom, you are not able to handle your wealth. That's why God was so pleased with Solomon because he asked for what is more important. Because when you have wisdom, you will know what wealth is for. You will know why God blesses us with prosperity. Without wisdom, wealth will consume us.

When do we become really poor? When we want only wealth and not wisdom. What is wealth for? Why are we given wealth and why does God bless us with prosperity?



Wisdom is what will enable us to handle wealth in a way that glorifies God. And when you do that, you become truly rich.

Reading I: 1 Kings 3:5, 7-12

⁵ The Lord appeared to Solomon, through a dream in the night, saying, "Request whatever you wish, so that I may give it to you." ⁷ Solomon answered: "O Lord God, you have caused your servant to reign in place of David, my father. But I am a small child, and I am ignorant of my entrance and departure. ⁸ And me, your servant is in the midst of the people that you have chosen, an immense people, who are not able



to be numbered or counted because of their multitude. ⁹ Therefore, give to your servant a teachable heart, so that he may be able to judge your people, and to discern between good and evil. For who will be able to judge this people, your people, who are so many? "¹⁰ And the word was pleasing before the Lord, that Solomon had requested this kind of thing. ¹¹ And the Lord said to Solomon: "Since you have requested this word, and you have not asked for many days or for wealth for yourself, nor for the lives of your enemies, but instead you have requested for you according to your words, and I have given you a wise and understanding heart, so much so that there has been no one like you before you, nor anyone who will rise up after you.



2. You Have Riches but No Relationship

There's a classic story of a man who asks the Lord, "Lord, give me a vision of Heaven and Hell."

So, he is given a vision of Heaven. And he sees that Heaven is a marvelous place, a big place-everything is big, everything is upsized. There's a feast there and the people are all full.

Then he sees Hell. And he notes that it is not any different from Heaven. Everything is also big; everything is also upsized. He sees the difference between Hell and Heaven when the people are already eating.

In Hell, the forks and spoons are so big, so long, that the people can't put the food into their mouth. And so, food that they can't eat is just thrown away. So, the people look malnourished.

In Heaven, their spoons are also long-- long enough for one person to feed another person. So, the people feed each other. So, they are well nourished.

What is the moral of the story? In Heaven, there are riches and relationships. In Hell there are also riches but no relationship.

Do you remember the Gospel about a rich man who has a rich harvest?

He says, "I will build bigger barns so that this wealth will only be mine."

What does the Lord say to him? "You fool. Tonight, your life will be taken from you. Where will all these riches go?"

The word *fool* comes from the Greek word *idiot*—which means *one who is alone, one who is isolated*. That is the danger of riches. It can isolate you. It can steal you from meaningful relationships.

So, when do you become truly rich? When you want riches but also relationships. And when do you become poor? When you want only riches -- but it isolates you from meaningful relationships.

Reading II: Romans 8:28-30

Brothers and sisters:

²⁸ We know that all things work for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose.
²⁹ For those he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, so that he might be the firstborn among many brothers and sisters. ³⁰ And those he predestined he also called; and those he called he also justified; and those he justified he also glorified.





3. When You Have Everything but Have Nothing

I remember Whitney Houston's song: "I have nothing, nothing, nothing if I don't have you." Alicia Keys also says, "Everything means nothing if I don't have you."

So, it's possible to have everything but also have nothing.

That's what Jesus says in the Gospel: to search for that fine pearl which is beyond all other riches. That fine pearl for which you are willing to give up everything because when you have it, you have everything.

Remember King Midas?

An angel appears to him and says, "I can grant you only one wish. So, think very well and I will give it to you."

King Midas says, "I hope everything I touch becomes gold." And the angel says, "Wish granted."

So, Midas, he touched the wall and his walls became gold. He touched his table, his chair—they all became gold. When it was time for him to eat, his food also became gold. When his child approached him and embraced him, his child became gold-- and even his wife. King Midas had everything but he had nothing.

Seek First...Not Only

Matthew 11:28 says, "Seek first the Kingdom of God and everything else will be given to you."

Why does the Gospel say that? It doesn't mean that God is against the world. No.

The verse just means that you shouldn't fall in love with the world-because the world cannot give you God. But fall in love with God-because God can give you the world.

That's why the verse says *seek first*. It doesn't say *seek only*. Because when you have God with you, everything else will follow. Everything else is secondary. When you have a living



relationship with God, everything else will fall into place.

You will have everything.

Tomorrow (July 31, 2023), I will be celebrating my 27th Anniversary in the priesthood.

And whenever I celebrate my anniversary, that's when I'm reminded that a priest forsakes many things-- you will be giving up a lot, you will sacrifice a lot.

But you know what the irony is?

All that you thought you have abandoned, God will bring back to you and you receive beyond what you expect. They said you'll have to leave your parents but everywhere I go, I meet fathers and mothers. They said you can't have a child and a family. But everywhere I go, children approach me and call me *father*.

When you find that pearl in Christ, then everything else is secondary and when you show God that you're longing for that fine pearl, God will bless you with even more.

My dear friends, that is the grace that you ask God: to look for genuine riches. We want to avoid becoming poor in the eyes of God. And when do you become poor? When you want only wealth over wisdom, when you want only riches but not relationships, and when you have everything but have nothing.

So, we pray for His grace as we continue our Holy Eucharist. Amen.



BRO. AUDEE VILLARAZA: Good Morning, Feast Bay Area! Thank you so much for being here in spite of the rain, in spite of the inconvenience. You know, that's a great way to praise God. You praise Him in the storm. It's easy to praise God when life is good... When you got the promotion, when you got the girl, when you got the guy. He said, "It's going to be raining today so just bring an umbrella."

Sometimes in life, you're going to get rained on, it's going to be inconvenient but just bring an umbrella. Just be prepared! Just be ready.

Again, I'm so grateful that you came here!

You are the reason that we do church. You know, we have a rule at The Feast.

Day before The Feast, when it's raining, there's a storm, some servants would ask us, "Bro, do we have Feast tomorrow? There's a storm."

Our rule is this: Even only one person comes to The Feast, *tuloy po ang Feast*—We hold The Feast. That's our rule-- because we want to serve you.

BRO. AUDEE VILLARAZA: I'm going to open the Talk for today. I pray that you receive this with an open heart. Because if you remember, we're still in our Mini-Series called *What Matters Most*.

What matters most to you? Is it your *Faith*? Is it your *Family*? Your *Finance*? Your *Fitness*?

Here's the last one we're going to talk about: The fifth essential that you need in life: It's called *Friendship*.

How many of you here are introverts? What are introverts? That's a good question. I'll show you what introverts are like:



The last photo I can really relate to.

From Introvert...

I'm an introvert, believe it or not. I'm like the type of person who enjoys being by himself. I like dating myself. When I was single, I used to love going to the movies by myself.

Are you like that?

And if you're an introvert, it's okay for you to eat alone in public places. You don't mind doing that. You don't mind people looking at you if you're alone by yourself. And you can do that for hours.



You know, when I was young, you could bring me to a playground, bringing just one toy, and you could leave me there for hours. I could create a multiverse in that playground. That's what I was.

...to Disciple

But you know, something happened when I grew up and when I entered into (the Light of Jesus) Community.

Community life is so different especially for introverts like me. Because all of a sudden, all of these people just started coming and started knocking on your door and they want to get to know you, they want to get into your life-- and it was hard. It's hard being in Community when you're an introvert.

But I realized something: That when I believed and I embraced the life of being a disciple, and I realized that the Lord also wanted to disciple me, you know what the one thing I finally understood? It's that how in the world will I be able to disciple people if I don't like people, if I don't open my life to people?






Here's the truth that you can take home today: Discipleship is relationship. If you look at the model of Jesus, the life that He modeled and He showed us, you will see what the first thing He did to start His Ministry.

You want to know the first thing that He did? He didn't perform miracles. He didn't show that He was God.

You know the first thing that He did, He looked for people. He looked for 12 guys. And you know the way that He invited them? He befriended them. He was not in a rush, not in a haste. He built a relationship around His disciples. That's how He started.

And this is the lesson for us. I'll give you Two Quick Lessons:



First lesson is this -- and this is for all the introverts—you need friends. I mean that's basic in life. No man is an island.

But here's a second lesson for all the extroverts:

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2. You don't need many, just a few good ones.
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You need friends, yes. But you don't really need a lot. You just need a few good friends.



How To Disciple People

Turn to the person beside you and tell that person: "You need just me." Because that's the truth. I mean look at Jesus. Jesus had followers, yes. A multitude wanted to follow Jesus. But here's the key: He had many followers but he had only a few close friends—the people that He kept around Him. He had 12, by the way.

The Bible says that when one time, Jesus went up the mountain and He transfigured, how many friends he had with Him? Only 3. When He went to the house of Jairus, the synagogue leader, to heal his daughter, how many persons were with Him? Only 3. So, Jesus even cut the group—the 12 persons He trusted and walked with. But here's something that you need to learn: it's not an assurance that if you're friends with people that they're real friends with you. I mean look at Judas. Judas betrayed Jesus. And it's okay—that's the lesson. It's okay that if you're not close to the person who's close to you -- it's okay. Why? Because you're not really meant to give access to everybody.

That's how you disciple people. Jesus, when He came into the world, He did not disciple the world. How many did He disciple? It is said, at one point, there were 500 disciples.

Now, question: There were probably already thousands, hundreds of thousands of persons living back then. Jesus was able to disciple only 500. You know who discipled the others? It was His disciples who spread the Gospel all over the world.

So, your lesson for today is this: Yes, you need friends, you need people to walk with, you need accountability partners. But you don't really need a lot. You need just very close persons—quality friends who you can walk with, who you can journey with, who really know who you are, who can pray for you.

Are you grateful for real friends? Do you have real friends with you right now? Praise God. Clap for those friends.

That's what we're going to talk about today. And I'm so grateful to be here in front of you because I get to introduce a real friend of mine who will preach to you, who will bless you, who will inspire you.

I'd like to call on none other than one of our Builders here at The Feast, Coach JC Libiran. Give him a big, big hand, Everyone. Talk

And I really believe that however bad the climate is, our God is more than good. That's how God is good to each one of us.




friendship bracelets, and even asking them to sign her Slum Book.



In the Scriptures, we see, particularly in the Old Testament, in 1 Samuel 20: 41-42, the friendship of David and Jonathan.


We have been into The Feast series on *Wilderness*. Where we have seen the covenant of God—the friendship of Yahweh with His people, Israel.


So, if you want to predict your future, show me your friends.

That's why Proverbs 27:9 says:




So, do you have friendships that refreshes *you*? Yes?

Maybe because the world that we live in right now is full of hatred, negativity, I even came across this in one of the stores:





Recently, my wife Milen and I went to Bacolod.



So, we will always remember that trip not just because of the food, not just because of the souvenirs. We were even reminded that it's not just the destination, it's not just who you are becoming in the process. But *who you are with* in your life journey.

Are you a friend to the people around you? Or maybe, you're the one asking them: "Be a friend to me."

You don't have to reinvent the wheel, my dear friends, because the Lord Himself preached to many—thousands. But at the same time, He was also


with His inner circle—with the disciples, with Peter, James, and John.


I remember, from the movie,


The Greatest Showman, Charity said to PT Barnum: "You don't need the whole world to love you. Just few good people.

Let's acknowledge our friends. Applaud them.




Roof Friends

And after that, he got a rock— and he wrote on the rock: "Today, my friend saved me."




So, question: How come Terry was doing all these – earlier he wrote on the sand, and then now, he's writing on stone. What's the purpose?



So, friend, you don't need to give advice to your friend. Actually, sometimes, when you give advice, you inadvertently hurt feelings.


Maybe just what you need to do is say, "Friend, even if I don't understand, I'm here for you—until the end."

HE CARES MISSION The Promised Land



A NURSERY for all kinds of plant seedlings. An animal shed for piglets and chicks providing daily food. A campsite for spiritual learning. This is the Promised Land of He Cares Mission, a non-profit organization for street children, part of our Mercy Ministries as one of our partner beneficiaries. In this issue, *The Feast Family* honors He Cares Mission, which, founded in 1996, marks its 27th Year this 2023.

Missionaries

He Cares is the story of Bro. Joe Dean Sola, longtime member of our Light of Jesus Family.

Once a carefree youth, Joe Dean, was one day short of cash. To have money, he called his elder brother Dan, an LOJ member, who at the time happened to be attending an LOJ Prayer Meeting at 56 Chicago, Cubao, Quezon City.

Dan told Joe Dean to come and get the money. Joe Dean arrived, had to sit at a corner to wait for Dan.



As he sat there, Joe Dean inevitably heard the talk of the preacher which centered on God's unconditional love and forgiveness.

Long story short, Joe Dean experienced a spiritual awakening and so, he served God, first with Bro. Bo Sanchez at our Anawim Home for Abandoned Elderly. There, he met Ardis, also an LOJ member who shared his passion of serving the poor. They fell in love, got married, and continued living as missionaries.

From Anawim, Joe Dean eventually devoted his life to ministering to the youth in need-- like he was before. So, he founded He Cares Mission for street children and, ably supported by Ardis, he has well sustained the Ministry.

Of late, He Cares is developing a sustainable farm community in San Rafael, Bulacan, called the Promised Land. Yes, a land fulfilling God's Promise to Abram long time ago.

Abram's Calling

In the Old Testament of the Bible, in its first book, *Genesis*, we read that God favored Abram for his faithfulness and obedience. God changed his name to Abraham, which means *father of many nations*. And so, for Abraham and his future offspring, God promised a land to settle in.

In Genesis 12:1, God said: "Leave your country, your people and your father's household and go to the land I will show you."

Genesis 12:7 adds that the Lord appeared to Abraham and said, "*To your offspring (or seed) I will give this land.*"

Historical accounts have named this land the Canaan, located in southern Levant, which is part of the Eastern Mediterranean region of West Asia.

Abraham's offspring, the Jews, or later called Israelites, became slaves of Egypt's pharaoh. But God sent Moses to set them free and bring them to Canaan, as Exodus 3:8 puts it:

"So, I have come down to deliver them from the power of the Egyptians, and to bring them up from that land to a good spacious land, to a land flowing with milk and honey, the place of the Canaanites..."

He Cares Promised Land

Like Abraham's descendants, He Cares' children somehow had been slaves not of an oppressive pharaoh, but of cruel poverty. He Cares Mission's passion is to set them free through a wholistic approach to loving the poorest of the poor.

He Cares Promised Land thus provides food, shelter, livelihood, and spiritual sanctuary for the children.

He Cares Promised Land may not be literally a land of milk honey—not yet. But today, the Promised Land already has a Nursery for all kinds of seedlings

to be planted.



The children as well as personnel of He Cares now enjoy fruits like bananas harvested from the farm.



The Promised Land also has an Animal Shed for piglets vaccinated by agriculturists with necessary vitamins to ensure their proper weight for their age. There are cages housing hens providing eggs for the children and for He Cares' feeding programs for street children every Saturday.



Campsite

He Cares Promised Land serves as perfect venue for training or other spiritual programs.

On February 16, 2023, 12 youth servants from He Cares Youth Worship Action Ministry (YWAM) completed at the Promised Land a nine-week Prayer and Life Workshop, a program where participants train to make praying and meditating on God's Word become a daily habit, and living out what they learn during the session.

Tagged *Paglalakbay Kasama si Jesus*, the workshop was also referred as Desert Day as each participant spent long hours in prayer and meditating on the Word, alone with the Lord and communing with nature.

Like how Jesus invited His disciples to withdraw from the crowd to spend time with Him. The participants spent the night bonding with one another, sharing experiences, praying, and singing praises to God. Early morning at dawn, the youth participants also learned and experienced how and why Jesus prayed alone, in silence and solitude, usually up on a mountain, to be with the Father.

They also shared how they could appreciate every creation -- the wind, trees, dogs, and more.

The loving Presence of God made them feel calm and peaceful, loved, being able to pour their heart out to God. Lastly, in response, they shared their written "Commitment ko kay Jesus" for their daily prayer habit, family, and service.

Yes, at He Cares Promised Land, they well declared, "Master, it is so good to be here." (Luke 9:33)

This way, He Cares Mission fulfills for the needy the promise in Peter 5:7 on which the Foundation has anchored its ministry: 1 Peter 5:7: "*Cast all worries to Him because He cares for you.*"
