Homily REV. FR. ALBERT GARONGon the Gospel Luke 24:35-48

Excerpts:

When I was still in the seminary, I went out for free time with my co-seminarians. It's rare for seminarians to go out. We were lucky if we were able to go out twice a month.

One time, we thought of visiting a new fast-food chain that was offering something innovative and unheard of at that time: it's called unli-rice.

There were 12 of us who went to their Tagaytay branch which was the nearest to us. We had a big table and indeed, we kept on ordering extra rice. At some point, we wondered when they would stop serving us.

Suddenly, we saw their manager talking to the server. We thought that it was a sign for them to stop serving us with extra rice. The waiter then went to the kitchen. When he came out, he was holding a rice cooker with freshly cooked rice. He went to our table and put it there.

The best part was when he said, "There is more."

It was the real deal.

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Doubts, Doubts

Sometimes, when you are met with such a bold and huge gift, it's so hard to receive it, right? There's a part of us that meets generosity with doubt. It usually serves us well.

When you receive a text message that says, "Congratulations! You won the raffle. Just click this link..." Of course, you know that it's not true. That's your instinct kicking in and serving you well. Most of the time, it's okay. But there is one time that we shouldn't do it-- and it is with the Lord.

In the Gospel, we see that very well. The disciples are already getting the news that Jesus is alive again. There are eyewitnesses already saying that He's alive.



But it just doesn't pierce them. It doesn't break through that doubt that Jesus is alive. We all know this feeling, right?



First Reading: Acts 3:13-15, 17-28

13 Peter said to the apostle: "The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified his servant Jesus whom you handed over and denied in the Pilate's presence when he had decided to release him. 14 You denied the Holy and Righteous One and asked that a murderer be released to you. 15 The author of life you put to death, but God raised him from the dead; of this we are witnesses. 17 Now I know, brothers, that you acted out of ignorance, just as your leaders did; 18 but

God has thus brought to fulfillment what we had announced beforehand through the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ would suffer. 19 Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away."

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Jesus First Says 'Peace'

Today, I'd like to offer how Christ meets our doubts in the way He met the doubts of the Apostles.

1. The first thing that Jesus said to them was, "Peace be with you."

That's meaningful because the first fear that the Apostles had was that if Christ was truly alive, they were doomed because they abandoned Him.

But Christ seized their fear and the first thing He told them was "Peace."

It was like Him telling them, "I know what you did-- but relax. I come in peace."

Many Catholics are afraid of Confession because they fear that we will be met with wrath and judgment.

But the Lord will always say, "Peace."

God's peace is always bigger than our sins. There is no contest. Every time someone comes to Him, the response is always "Peace."



Second Reading: 1|John 2:1-5

I My children, I am writing this to you so that you may not commit sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous one. 2 He is expiation for our sins, and not for our sins only but for those of the whole world. 3 The way we may be sure that we know Him is to keep his commandments. 4 Those who say, "I know him," but do not keep his commandments are liars, and the truth is not in them.

5 But whoever keeps his word, the love of God is truly perfected in him.



Responsorial Psalm: Psalms 4: 2, 4, 7-8, 9

Second: Hope


2. After Peace comes Hope.

Hope in the sense that what Jesus does with the Apostles is to explain the Scripture to them.

None of what happened was an accident. The Crucifixion is not one last gamble or last resort for God to save us.

Everything that happened-- that scared us so much-- has always been in God's plans.

The source of our hope is simply that




We all use our free will. Because it's in God's hands, it can always be meaningful, purposeful, and useful to help you and heal you to make you grow.

That is our hope. God never promised a pain-free life. What He promised was that none of it would go to waste if you put it in God's hands. It would always have meaning. That is our superpower as Christians. Claim it.

The world looks at pain and wants to destroy it because people think that pain is the end. Suffering can be an instrument for our growth and holiness. It is transformed in the same way that one lifeless was entered into the tomb and the Source of Life came out of that.







Third: Love

Peace and Hope. Finally, God meets our doubts with Love in its purest form-- which is Presence.

Jesus, the Person Himself, came to them.

More important, the disciples recognized Jesus in His act of eating. They recognized Jesus when He broke the bread.

It says there how so much of our relationships are formed over food. When you invite the person to have coffee with you, it's not about the beverage-- but to deepen relationships. Most important, God's Presence will continue to be with us in the form of broken bread -- the Eucharist.

The Eucharist Mass is everything. In here, you meet God in the flesh. At the end of it, we get to partake in that Presence. All our faith practices are based on and lead towards meeting the Person of Jesus Christ, especially in the Eucharist. This is where His real Presence is found.

We have doubts and weaknesses but see how God meets all of them with Peace, Hope, and Love.

Whenever you feel any doubt, remember what the server in the Tagaytay restaurant told us: "There is more. It will not run out. Don't worry."

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Love Offering



I decided I'm going to give you an ". Some say this is a life-saving skill. It will save your life.

You see, semi-old people like me, we lose our balance so much. Because old people lose their balance and then they fall. And when they fall, it will break a bone. And when they break a bone, what happens is their health deteriorates.

I learned about this skill, and I said, "Oh, my gosh, it's true. I'm losing my balance. And so, what I did was I tried to stand on one foot and then I said, "Ang hirap. It's hard. You know, I actually lost my balance.

Young people, you're laughing at me right now.

You're saying, "Ang dali-dali niyan. That's easy to do."

But, yes, it's true. When I was young, probably it was easy.

So, (with the help of Sis. Marowe) I'm going to demonstrate this. If there are volunteers here who want to imitate me, you just follow me.





First, take off your shoes.




Next, take off your socks.



Stand on one leg, and try to pick up your sock... and try to wear it.



Pick up your shoe, wear the shoe, and tie the lace.



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The Key: Consistency

Three months ago, I would fall about 10 to 12 times doing that exercise.

But I thought to myself, "I put on my shoes every day. Why don't I try doing it every single day. Every single day. Every single day. And three months later, I was so much better.

And the key is this: Be consistent. If you want changes in your life, just be consistent in anything-- whether you say to yourself, you know, "I lack water," or "I lack sleep," or "I need to exercise more," or whatever...



You just have to be consistent, and just keep on doing it every single day. Now, what has this got to do with what we're doing right now?

There are people who go to The Feast once a month. They go to The Feast when they *feel* like it, when it fits their schedule... They go to The Feast when it's not raining...

When it rains, they are like, "Ay, huwag na lang... I won't go anymore." They go to The Feast when they already need to go: "Kailangan ko nang pumunta... I need to go...I already feel spiritually dry..."

You know, they go to The Feast based on feelings and convenience.

I want you to know if you're not consistent, you're delaying the process of gaining your strength. I became stronger in my muscles simply by doing something every single day, for less than 60 seconds. Like, every single day, in less than 60 seconds, putting on my shoes and my socks, standing on just one leg. And little by little, I got better.

This is my point: I want you to make a commitment to go to The Feast--whether you like going or not, whether you feel going or not, whether it rains or not, whether there's traffic or none, whether it's difficult to park in PICC or not...

I mean, just say, "It's non-negotiable. I'm going to be consistent. I'm going to feed my spirit. I'm going to nourish my soul. I'm going to strengthen my relationship with God. I'm going to be with my brothers and sisters in Community. I'm going to be consistent."

Make a Commitment

When you're consistent, here's what's going to happen: You're going to be stronger. You're going to be better. You're going to be blessed more because you are in the place of blessings. You are in the place of miracles. You are nearer, you're proximate to the God who blesses-- when you open up yourself every Sunday to the Presence of God.

Be consistent. Just make a decision every week. Non-negotiable.



By the way, this morning, I had Prayer Room. This is a podcast on TikTok and Facebook-- and hundreds of people join me *live* and then thousands catch up through the replay.

This morning was very interesting. I had two phones in front of me for messages-- one for TikTok viewers and one for Facebook.

And I said, "Hi, guys, Happy Sunday! Join me at The Feast! There's a Feast near you!"

The people started messaging: "What is The Feast?"

They didn't know what The Feast was.

One said, "...Oh, it's a spiritual gathering..."

My Friends, you've got officemates and classmates, and friends, who don't even know what The Feast is. And you need to talk to them and tell them to come...

And then, I love this part...

One said, "Bro. Bo, I'm in Iloilo. Is there a Feast here?"

"Yes, there is. Please search on Facebook Feast Iloilo."

Another person asked, "Bro. Bo, where's The Feast in Cebu?"

"Oh, Ayala Malls. Search on Facebook Feast."

Then, somebody said, "Bro. Bo, I'm a Feaster in CDO (Cagayan de Oro, Mindanao).

Another said, "I'm a Feaster in Feast Dasma (Dasmariñas, Cavite)."

Somebody said, "Bro. Bo, yung Feast sa Dagupan?"

"Oh, there's a Feast in Dagupan. It's a small one. But it's vibrant and it's there."

My Friends, there's a Feast in Bataan. There is. There are Feasts in hundreds of cities, in 26 countries.

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Do Not Give up

I'm telling you, it's worth it when you are consistent. Mahihirapan ka-- you will have difficulty, of course. Every day, I put on my shoe and my sock with one leg, standing on one leg -- it's difficult. Why am I being hard on myself?

In the same way, when you start making a commitment to be at The Feast every week, that's difficult. It's raining-you go? No parking-- you still go?



But it's a good thing. It will strengthen you. And it will bless your life.

I want you to support The Feast.

I want you to give whatever the Lord wants you to give. And make it a decision, make it a habit.

The Bible says do not give up the habit of meeting together.*

And I'm going to appropriate that verse for you: Do not give up the habit of being here every week-- or whatever Feast you belong to.

Do not give up the habit of giving and supporting the movement that God is doing in this world.

My dear Friends, The Feast is not perfect. And the people around you, they are not perfect. We're all a bunch of weird, strange, horrible people. We've got sins, and we've got weaknesses.

So, please be careful... You know, during Communion time, you see flashed on the screen "Take care of your belongings."

You know, because we're a bunch of struggling sinners here, don't be too safe, thinking "I'm with saints."

We're a bunch of imperfect people-- who are struggling, who fail. But you know what? We're doing it together. We're reaching out to the Lord every week and we're saying, "Lord God, come."

The perfect people don't come here. But because we're imperfect, we need God.

*Let us not give up meeting, as some are in the habit of doing.

But let us encourage one another and all the more
as you see the Day approaching. --Hebrews 10:25.

Everybody, say:

"I need God every day, every week." Consistency. Consistency.

Raise your Love Offering envelope, and just say this with me:

Lord Jesus, I Thank You that You are giving me this opportunity to give to a movement, to a community that is changing thousands of people all over the world.



And I Thank You that You are giving me the gift of consistency of faithfulness, to be here in Your spiritual family every week. In Jesus' Name. Amen. Give to the Lord, Everybody. Love the Lord.

Amen. Give the Lord a big hand. Love Him. You belong to God. You belong to God. Oh, yes!


If you can put your arms around somebody and announce to that person "You belong to God! You belong to God! You belong to God"



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You Look Like God

The Scripture I'm going to read is not new. You've heard this Scripture time and time again. I'm choosing this passage because it encourages me so much to know how God sees me.

To those who might be new here, if you don't know how God sees and loves you, this Scripture will change that:

So God created human beings in his own image.
In the image of God he created them.

Genesis 1:27 NLT

It's plain and simple. According to the Scripture, you look like God.

The biggest problem with many of us is that we don't usually like ourselves, especially the way we look. If you're young enough and have the time and resources, you'll probably have something done to yourself.

But here's the thing: that's how God made you. You were created in His image and likeness. For everyone who is in here and even those watching online, you made the right decision to come to church today.

The enemy doesn't want you here. He doesn't want you to hear from the preacher that you are created in God's image and likeness. The enemy wants you to hate yourself for who you are. But God wants to tell you that you are perfectly, completely, and absolutely loved-- because He created you.

The enemy is shaking because you're here in church and you're bound to be encouraged by this message today. When you start loving who you are and how God made you to be, you're likely to do great things for God.

Here's our big message for today:



COPY CHRIST

Let's pray...

"Father, this is Your Word. We thank You that you are here with us.

Thank you for creating us in your image and likeness. Teach us how to love and appreciate ourselves the way you appreciate us. Teach us that because Jesus is in us, we can do great things through His Name. In Jesus' Name. Amen.

Thy Word is a Lamp unto my feet and a Light unto my path.

Surprise: Two Lessons!

Copying has been a practice in every culture.

For example, you copy an original song and you try to make it your own. You copy something so successful, and you try to bank on that.

Copying can be good especially if you copy the good stuff. There is, however, also danger in copying.

When I was in high school, our Science teacher announced that there would be a pop quiz. Of course, we were not prepared for it-- 50 percent of the students in the room started grumbling.

There was only one guy who was grinning from ear to ear. Ernesto (*not his real name*) was the smartest guy in our class, and he was probably prepared for the quiz.

Suddenly, something crazy happened for the very first time. Ernesto, who always sat at the front, discretely showed his paper on the side and prodded people to copy his answers. We were shocked because he had never done that before.

Of course, no one hesitated one bit. Everyone copied his answers-- including yours truly. This was before I was saved.

By the end of the test, we were so proud because we would pass the test. We generously thanked Ernesto for that unbelievable act.

Two days later, the same teacher came in and handed our test papers back. We were so excited to see our test papers. But to our surprise, we all failed. We couldn't understand. Even Ernesto had that discouraged look.


A week later, one of our female classmates asked if she could borrow a pen from Ernesto. He gladly said *yes* and told her to get the pen from his bag.

When our classmate opened the bag, she saw Ernesto's test paper -- with a perfect score of 20/20. She was surprised because we copied his answers, didn't we? Why did Ernesto pass and the rest of the class fail? As she looked closely, she noticed that each answer had an erasure. Ernesto let us copy his wrong answers-- then erased them and wrote the right ones.

What are the lessons from this story?


- 1. Study hard
- 2. Be careful what you copy





1. You may be copying a copy from a copy. For example, back then, original cassette tapes were expensive. If you didn't have the budget and resources, you would just buy a blank cassette tape because you could record over and over on that tape. But if you didn't have access to the original tape, you could resort only to a copy of the original tape. But you would have incoherent recording ever.

In the *Book of Judges* we read that there was a time when the Israelites were already in the Promised Land but their leader wasn't Moses anymore. It was Joshua. During the reign of Joshua, there was prosperity in the whole land. They were obedient to the Lord-- until something happened...



The first settlers in the Promised Land* were obedient to the Lord because they received the law of God directly from Moses. As years passed, the succeeding generations never even saw Moses. They had never seen the Tabernacle. They didn't know about God. So, the quality of faith dropped. They were copying from another copy of another copy.

Why? Because the parents failed to teach them about God. They did not know that what they were worshiping was somebody else's golden calf-- no longer God.

Copying Conflicts

Parents today can make the same mistake. What you do as parents, especially when your kids are young, can affect them when they grow up. Whatever you give priority to will eventually be what their priority too when they become parents.

When they see you going to the mall instead of going to church, they'll copy that and do the same, and their children will copy them. Don't blame your teenagers when they do not pray—if you never taught them how to pray when they were younger.




*Editor's Note: In Genesis 12, we read that Abraham, the patriarch of the Jews (or the Israelites) was so faithful to God that God promised Abraham would be the father of nations and He promised He would give Abraham and his people a land of their own.

The Promised Land was the land of Canaan-- the region south and southwest of the Lebanon mountains, north and east of Egypt, east of the Mediterranean coastal plain, and west of the Arabian desert.

In the ancient world, people known as Philistines occupied a small part of southern Canaan called Philistia. Later, the Greeks called the place Palestine.

As we know, to this day, Israel and Palestine are still in conflict over territorial rights over the place, not to mention, as some accounts point out, unsettled differences in religious beliefs.



2. Imitating Injuries. When we're not conscious, we copy the injuries of people. Sometimes, external factors such as our parents, siblings, and environment, create a ceiling that tells us to stop because we're limited.

"This is the way your dad did this."

"This is the only way your mom showed you how to do this."

Some of these limitations are lies and we're very loyal to some of these lies.

4 WAYS TO RECLAIM YOUR IMAGO-DEI


To avoid copying the wrong identity as well as the injuries, you have to reclaim and restore your *Imago-Deity*, or your God-identity.

Here are four ways:

1. Embrace creativity, not just consumption

Have you ever sat on a couch and looked at your phone? Before you know it, three hours have passed by and you were just scrolling through your phone for messages.

The thing is that you're not meant to overconsume because when you do, you neglect your God-given gift to create.



We have a God who is unlimited. He came and tore open the ceiling. He broke the tradition because He wants to tell us that nothing is impossible.

3. Embrace personal encounters, not secondhand rumors

God is inviting you to come and see Him. Don't just anchor your faith on the faith of another person. Don't base your salvation on somebody else's story. Have your personal experience of God.

4. Embrace character, not image

Once upon a time, I asked our Worship team why they signed up for the Ministry. They said that they did so because it looked cool to be onstage to sing or they did so because they wanted to sing like the singer they saw before.

Those are logical answers, but I wanted them to go deeper into that reason. If you're here onstage and singing every Sunday, I want the people to be inspired by your faith more than by your singing.

When I started preaching at The Feast, like many other preachers, I thought the trade secret to learning the craft was to copy from how other preachers do it. You borrow the style and the technique. I studied the way our other preachers did it. I tried some of the things that they did until I realized that I was just going to be a poor version of them.

Copying Preachers

For instance, I'm a poor version of Bro. John Ben Rodriguez who is good at comedy. He can instantly tell a joke-- on the spot. In my case, I must prepare my jokes a week before I go onstage. I practise it in front of a mirror.

I'm also a poor version of Bro. Ryan Capitulo. Have you ever heard him sing his version of *Thy Word?* It's like he is in a singing contest. It's that amazing.

I'm also a poor version of Bro. Lep Sumera with the way he connects with the young people. He knows the language of the young.

I have to take a crash course to understand your language.

I'm also a poor version of Bro Didoy Lubaton who is a good mentor when it comes to crucial conversations.

He knows about "carefrontation."

(a combination of the words *care* and *confrontation*). I'm not really good at it in a

face-to-face manner.

I'm also a poor version of Bro. Alvin Barcelona who preaches so eloquently in Tagalog. It's deep and heartfelt. If I preach in Tagalog, my brain will buffer every five minutes.

I'm also a poor version of Bro. Bo Sanchez whose wisdom is beyond me. Plus his K-Drama game is untouchable.

He's amazing, right?

I'm just the worst version of all these preachers. I can't be like them.

But you know, I'm the best version of Audee Villaraza.

Let me say the same thing to you:

You're the best version of you. Nobody can do you. With all your complications and with all your uniqueness, nobody can be you.

Be the Jesus in You

My message is *Be you*. But don't just be you. On your own, you're just an imperfect version.

Be the Jesus in you.

Did you know that you cannot be played by any other person other than you? You're so unique.

My son has friends who are triplets named Faith, Hope, and Love. I can't tell them apart but Ethan can.

Hope has the smallest face.

Faith has a birthmark on her arm.

Love is a hugger. She's the one hugging Ethan.

We're all unique in the eyes of God. No matter what labels have been placed on you and the names that you have been called, that's not who you are.

You are a child of God. You carry that image wherever you go: Imago Dei.



"Father, as we lift our hands to acknowledge that Your Presence is before us. Help us to reclaim our lost identity. Because the world has projected all of these labels, insinuations, and brandings on us, we got lost. But today, Lord, we realize that underneath the veil, we are just like You. We are loving, good, and holy like You. We embrace this image. We need Jesus to be inside of us and that identity to be locked in our hearts, where nobody can take it from us. Thank You for loving us and for being with us. We pray for more of You in our lives. Come and be with us as we worship You in spirit and truth. Come, Jesus, come.



How God Sees You

The Spirit of the Lord is here with us today. Before we commit our life to Jesus -- our past, present, and future-- let me just preach this Word from the *Book of Matthew*. This will speak in the season of your life when you are questioning some things -- whether God loves you, whether there are some things that you hate about yourself.

This is how God sees you:

13 Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptized by John. 14 But John tried to deter him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" 15 Jesus replied, "Let it be so now; it is proper for us to do this to



fulfill all righteousness." Then John consented. 16 As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. 17 And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased."



This was the time when Jesus had not performed any miracles yet. This was the time when His public ministry was not activated yet. Suddenly, God showed up in a voice after John baptized Jesus.

God said, "This is my Son, with him I am pleased..."

I'm telling you this is a game-changer. This changes the way you see how God sees you. This changed my life-- about how I see how God sees me.

Before Jesus did anything for the Father, God said "This is my Son who gives me great joy."

So, my Friends, listen to this:

Before you do anything for God, know that He already said, "You are my son. I am well-pleased by you. You don't need to do anything to earn my love, to be accepted, because you already are..."

While you are still a sinner, God already forgave you. God already loved you. You don't need to earn it. You just need to accept it, to walk in it, to receive it.

Commitment

Are you ready to walk in the great favor of God? Raise your hand if that's you. Hallelujah!

Father, look at all your children who love You, who worship You, who want to be with You. At this moment, I pray, Lord, that You would shift their hearts and return their identity, that identity that has been in their DNA since the beginning. You created them for a purpose and You love them so much...

Everybody, say this: Lord, Thank You for loving me, for accepting me, for embracing me-- not for what I did but for what Jesus did. Thank You that You are my God. Change me like only You can. In Jesus' Name. Amen."

My parents blessed me with a good education-- elementary grades at the Macalelon Elementary School; high school at the Arellano University, Sta. Ana, Manila; and college also at Arellano University where I earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration, major in Accounting.

*The Book of Genesis, Chapters 6-9, narrates that ten generations after the time of Adam and Eve, the Earth became corrupt and filled with violence. God thus

I have five siblings but the first two already joined our Creator. I have no idea as to the whereabouts of my three other siblings.




But yes, God is Good. By His Divine Design, I happened to have a friend who happened to know about Anawim. She referred me to Anawim and Anawim kindly welcomed me.



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
