

15th Founding Anniversary this May, which is also the month we celebrate Mother's Day, May 12, *page 29*.



Homily

REV. FR. ANGELO PAOLO O. ASPRER, S.S.P. on the Gospel John 15:1-8

Excerpts:

ONE of the famous and most-tendered symbolisms that Jesus used as He illustrated God's relationship with His people is the image of the vine and the branches.

Viticulture or the culture of grapes for winemaking is significant to Jewish culture. Wine symbolizes life, vitality, abundance, and blessings.

We heard in our Gospel Reading today of Jesus speaking about Himself as the True Vine, about God as the Vine-grower, and about us as the Branches.

We can only have fullness of life, meaning, purpose, and direction if we remain in God. Apart from God, there is death, destruction, despair, and desolation.

Grape cultivation requires a high level of care. At times, it needs to be pruned. It's just like life, isn't it? It comes with pruning because of our toils and tears. God allows pruning not to punish us but for us to produce more fruits.

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Fruitless... Or Faithful?

Our Second Reading today says that success or fruitfulness in one's life can be seen through the person's daily decisions, choices, and relationships. You will know how deep the faith of one person is through the quality of his decisions and relationships.

Our First Reading reminds us that to be successful and fruitful, we must have that change of mindset and outlook like St. Paul, The Apostle. Our perspective can either be our prison or our passport to a different life. It's not easy to embrace change.

Growth is painful. But nothing is as painful as being stuck in a situation wherein we do not grow and do not truly belong.

My dear Feasters, are you successful in life?

Is The Feast Community successful?

Are you successful? Are you fruitful? You may be successful, but you're not bearing fruits. In as much as you are fruitful, but you are not always successful. We don't bear fruits all the time. Sometimes, we have barren moments.

But even though we are fruitless, we remain faithful.



First Reading: Acts 9:26-31

²⁶ When Saul arrived in Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him, not believing that he was a disciple. ²⁷ Then Barnabas took charge of him and brought him to the apostles, and he reported to them how on the way he had seen the Lord and that he had spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken out boldly in the name of Jesus. ²⁸ He moved about freely with them in Jerusalem, and spoke out boldly in the name of the Lord. ²⁹ He also spoke and debated with the Hellenists, but they

tried to kill him. ³⁰ And when the brothers learned of this, they took him down to Caesarea and sent him on his way to Tarsus. ³¹ The church throughout all Judea, Galilee, and Samaria was at peace. It was being built up and walked in the fear of the Lord, and with the consolation of the Holy Spirit it grew in numbers.

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What Is Success?

I recall these two university professors, Howard Stevenson and Lauren Nash.

They made a survey among their business students. They wanted to find out what makes a person truly and enduringly successful.

For these professors, success is a broad concept. For someone to be truly successful, a person or a company must possess these four irreducible traits which means that if one lacks one of these traits, then that person or that company cannot be considered successful.



1. Happiness

The definition of happiness depends on the person defining it. There is fleeting happiness and there is lasting happiness. You can be happy about yourself, but others don't feel the same for you.

2. Achievement

Do you have accomplishments that you claim as your own?

3. Significance

Has your life created a positive impact on the lives of others?

4. Legacy

Your success should not only serve you and your loved ones but should also serve the greater community of God.



Second Reading: 1 John 3:18-24

18 Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth. 19 Now this is how we shall know that we belong to the truth and reassure our hearts before him 20 in whatever our hearts condemn, for God is greater than our hearts and knows everything. 21 Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have confidence in God 22 and receive from him whatever we ask, because we keep his commandments and do what pleases him. 23 And his commandment is this: we should believe

in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and love one another just as he commanded us. 24 Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in them, and the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit that he gave us.

Is Jesus Successful?

Is being successful the only challenge we have in life? Perhaps there is more to being successfuland that is to live a fruitful life.

When you look at Jesus hanging on the Cross, can you say He is successful? Not all the time.

But He lived a fruitful life.

What is the difference between being successful and being fruitful?

When you're successful, you always want to be number one. There is nothing wrong with it. Excellence is a virtue.

When you are a fruitful person, you put others first-- before your concerns. Many times, service comes first.

The beloved comes first.

When you are successful, there is always the tendency to compare

and despair. We, the Pauline priests, produce programs.

Our mantra is, "We are only good as our last performance."

Sometimes, there is a tendency to measure our worth and dignity with the passing standards of the world. But when you are fruitful, your simple desire is to bear fruit. You do not compare.

Each of us has his own journey. When you're successful and depart from this world, people will forget your achievements. But when you are fruitful, even when you depart from this world, the good seeds that you sowed will continue to bear fruit.



My dear Friends, that is the ultimate challenge of our Readings today. The ultimate goal of life is not just success but fruitfulness.

Fruitfulness is not always success. Fruitfulness means faithfulness. Even though we do not bear fruits at all, we remain faithful to the Lord. Amen.

Good Morning, Church!


First, we'd like to welcome all the first-timers. Yes. Welcome Home! And I believe we have a lot of young people from De La Salle.

Give somebody a Hi-5 or a big hug. Just greet one another and once again, tell that person, "I'm happy you're here."



That's the reason people buy light bikes. There are videos there on how to change your bike handle to something lighter, change the fork to carbon, change your seat and your wheels to something thinner...

But you see, when I bike, I'm not after speed. My goal is not only to strengthen my heart and my lungs but to develop muscles. Because of my busy schedule, I bike only for 30 minutes to 1 hour a day. 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The Goal

The point I'm driving at is this:

Life is a journey.

Life is not a sprint, it's a marathon. The goal is not speed but strength.


People ask me: "Bro. Bo, where do you go when you ride your bike?"

I answer, "To a coffee shop."

I bike to a coffee shop. In there,

I drink my coffee. I pray. I read. I love it!

But the destination is not the coffee



What is the goal of your life? Is it to go to Heaven? I'm telling you: *Yes* and *No*.

We all want to go to Heaven. We talked about this last Easter Sunday. Heaven is not a place for ethereal souls floating on clouds. Heaven is going to be corporal, physical, and amazing. But Heaven is not the goal.

The goal of your life is to gain spiritual strength. The goal of your life is to become more like Jesus.

Do you know how to become spiritually stronger? It's when you go through difficulty.

Say this after me: "I will take up my c ross."

Trials in your life are crosses but so are responsibilities. When you take responsibility, you gain spiritual muscle. You do things you're not supposed to do.

Think about it: Why should I serve the Lord for 40-plus years? It's a responsibility that I do not need. But when I started to be responsible for the people in my life, I became stronger. I've got 200 hundred employees in my business. I'm responsible for them. I wake up in the morning and I think about them. My business must grow because if not, 200 families will starve. They are my responsibility and it's difficult. But guess what? It's good! I'm getting stronger.


When God calls you to do something, say *Yes* even if it's difficult. Do it even if it's something you don't want to do.

We all want a comfortable life but I'm speaking God's Word to you now: You will be weak if you do not take responsibility.

What is the goal of life? It is a marathon to gain spiritual strength through the difficulties and the burdens of life.

Thank you. Let's give Bro. Bo a round of applause. We need that message: That we need to be strong -- mind, body, spirit. Yes?

We often hear the saying, "Life is short, better enjoy it!"

We all agree, right?

Because of this thinking, we also subscribe to a lifestyle of "Eat, Drink, and be Merry for tomorrow, we die."

It's just but right that we enjoy the fruits of our labor. But sometimes, we become too focus on the *now*. We pursue worldly matters such as money, fame, or power. At one point in our lives, all of us are guilty of that crime. I'm not saying those are all wrong...

English preacher Charles Spurgeon said, "Life is short. Eternity is long. It is only reasonable that this short life be lived in the light of eternity."


What you believe about eternity determines how you live today.

Today's Message





As we go into the last talk of our *L.I.F.E* series, we will discuss about *ETERNITY* to answer the questions: 1. Where do we go? 2. How do we get there?

Our desire for holy and heavenly pursuits never ends. A lot of TV shows and movies have been created for us to have an idea of what Heaven or Eternity is but still, a void, a question, remains in our hearts.

When you talk about eternity, there are terms that have been written in the Bible such as *everlasting life, Kingdom of God*, or *salvation*.

The Hebrew word for *age* is *olam*. It speaks of a period of time, a reference to the past, like during the time of Moses, during the time of Abraham.

But we emphasize here that when you are under the Lordship of Jesus, Heaven is not just something experienced *beyond*. It's something that we experience right here, right now. If God reigns in your heart, no boundaries. Nothing can separate us from the love of God.

But here's the challenge: Are we living in God's terms or in our own terms? When it's always our way, that's not Heaven. It's an absence of God.

Our one big message today is this:

You are destined to be with God forever.

The imposition of ashes on our foreheads during the Ash Wednesday tells us that from dust we came and shall return. Each time we visit wakes-- it wakes you up. It reminds you that *susunod ka na*--you will be next. I'm not saying this to frighten you. Dying should not be scary when you have God in your life.

Susunod ka na means you will follow. Who will you follow? Jesus. If you are a Jesus follower, no need to worry in this life and in the next life.



Let's honor the Word of God: *Thy Word is a Lamp unto my feet and a Light unto my path.*

The verse is taken from the Gospel of Mark, Chapter 10 verse 17. The rich young man said:

Good teacher, he asked,

"what must I do to inherit

eternal life?"

- Mark 10:17, NLT


The rich young man ruler who has everything already -- yet in his heart and mind, something is still lacking.

Maybe that's the reason this man's name was never mentioned in the Bible. He represents each of us. Whatever

the state of our faith is, there is still something that we're lacking.

I'm reminded here of the encyclical of Pope John Paul II, *Veritas Splendor-- The Splendor of Truth--* which speaks about the teaching of the Church:

Christ does not abandon us. So, we should walk with Him. And as we shift our focus now on the rich young man ruler, we would have the same experience>



Three Truths about ETERNITY



There are three truths about Eternity I want to share with you:

1. Eternal life is a gift from God.

"For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life through Christ Jesus our Lord." - Romans 6: 23, NLT

You have been given a precious gift. Are you accepting it? Are you receiving it? Are you giving importance to it? Are you sharing it to others?

When it comes to Eternity, we always ask: "What happens to us when we die?"

When we look into the Catechism of the Catholic Church, we are reminded that once we die, our body decays and our soul meets God. Lastly, we wait for the reunion with God, the full communion. Of course, there is discussion about Heaven, Hell, and Purgatory.

Heaven is not a place. It is God's Presence in your life. If God is in your life now, then you are in Heaven. On the other hand, Hell speaks about the absence of God. Purgatory is the necessary purification.

3 States of the Church

- 1. Church Triumphant (in Heaven)
 We ask for the intercession of saints
 when we pray
- 2. Church Militant (on Earth)

Bro. Bo reminds us that we are pilgrims. We are journeying. The good thing is that you are not journeying by yourself. We travel together. This is the gift of our Feast.

3. Church Suffering (in Purgatory)

These are the souls in Purgatory. They need our prayers.

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2. God has planted a seed of Eternity in your heart.

"God has set eternity in their (OUR) hearts" – Ecclesiastes 3:11

Whether you fully understand this or not, the Lord has already planted the seed of Eternity in your heart.

We want to celebrate this and share it with others.

3. Because of God's promise and love, everlasting life is possible.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever

believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." - John 3:16, NIV



That's why every Lent, we are reminded of what the Lord has done during his Passion, Death, and Resurrection. God has shown that whatever happened to Jesus will also happen to us.

This reminds us of the story-- even before Jesus died and resurrected-- the story of Mary and Martha losing their brother Lazarus (whom Jesus raised from death.) Very dramatic.

Amid the drama, here's Jesus saying:

"I AM THE
RESURRECTION
AND THE LIFE.
ANYONE WHO
BELIEVES IN ME WILL
LIVE, EVEN AFTER
DYING. EVERYONE
WHO LIVES IN ME AND
BELIEVES IN ME WILL
NEVER EVER DIE. DO
YOU BELIEVE THIS?"

- JOHN 11: 25-26, NLT

How about you? Do you believe in this?


It takes time for this to happen. As Bro. Bo said, our spiritual life should keep better and better.

3 WAYS TO PREPARE FOR ETERNITY

Now, if those are the three truths, let me now challenge you to do these three ways to prepare for Eternity:

1. Ask for God's Mercy-- and Repent

I'm reminded of Jesus' dialogue with the good thief who said to Him, "Lord, remember me when you are in Paradise."



Jesus said to him, "Today, you will be with me in Paradise."

It gives us the assurance that even if you are the worst sinner there is, the eternal life can still be given to you. The God that we have is a God of many chances, a God full of mercy.

2. Accept and surrender to God.

Let go of controlling, complaining, and comparing. Those are the ways of the enemy to snatch us from our promise to fully surrender to God.

3. Act and share this gift of Eternity to others.

I want to honor all of you are here. You're not just coming by yourself. You represent the people you are with from Monday to Saturday. After The Feast, you get to share to them the Good News of the Lord. Not everyone can come to The Feast—so we bring The Feast to them.

I'm a life coach. I ask questions so that people can understand, discover, acknowledge the truth in them.

As I ask you these questions, treat this as a real talk, not just with yourself but with God.

You may be ready or not ready to answer these questions, but nothing can change the truth that you and I are destined to be with God forever. Nothing can take that away.



How will you live your life DIFFERENTLY if you know that one day you will die?

How will you live your life if you were only given one week to live?

How are you preparing for eternal life?

Receive God's Message Now

I've had many near-death experiences. I'm just blessed to stand before you.

I know that God has a lot in store not just for me but for all of us.

Let's remember that we will not experience Eternity just when we die. As early as now, we can experience that when we have Jesus in our hearts.

That's why I love *The Parable of the Talents* in Matthew 25:33 where Jesus said to that faithful servant:



'WELL DONE, MY GOOD AND FAITHFUL SERVANT...

COME, SHARE YOUR MASTER'S JOY.'



Receive that message *now* in this life-- not in the afterlife. Put your hands on your heart. Embrace yourself. Say this prayer after me:

Dear God, grant me the grace to live for what lasts for eternity. I come to you in trust and surrender of* my life here and beyond. I won't live just for today. I will live for Your glory. I believe in the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Heaven is here. Experience Jesus' love right here, right now.

GRACE TO BE BORN Starting with a Miracle

THIS month of May, Grace To Be Born marks its 15th Founding Anniversary. Why May? Read on...

GRACE TO BORN has embraced as its Patron Saint Our Lady of Guadalupe, Protectress of Unborn Children.

Devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe began way back in 1531. Tradition has it that Mama Mary appeared to an Aztec (part of an ethnic group in Mexico) named Juan Diego, in Guadalupe, a city in northeastern Mexico-who converted to Christianity.

Mary appeared on Tepeyac Hill (now a suburb of Mexico City) twice. On her second appearance, Juan Diego opened his cloak and a dozen roses fell out. An image of Mary was imprinted on the cloak -- this image now at the Basilica of Guadalupe.

Online accounts on Our Lady say that when she appeared on Tepeyac Hill, she introduced herself as Mother of God and Mother of Humanity. So, to this day, she has been proclaimed as Patron Saint of Mexico and Patroness of the Americas.



Apparently since "humanity" connotes human life, Aztec art presents an image of Mary as pregnant. Note that in the image, Mary is wearing around her waist a black girdle-- a symbol of pregnancy. So, in 1999, Pope John Paul II named her Protectress of Unborn Children.

Divine Design

Fast forward to the Year 2008. In August 2008, preaching at The Feast, then still being held at the Valle Verde Country Club in Pasig City, Bro. Bo Sanchez talked about the evils of abortion.



By Divine Design, among the audience happened to be Bro. Rey Ortega, brainchild of most of our Mercy Ministries, with his supportive wife, Sis. Myrna.

Also, by God's grace, a month before, in July 2008, Bro. Rey and Sis. Myrna just came from a pilgrimage to Our Lady of Guadalupe Shrine in Mexico City. There, they learned about Our Lady being the Protectress of the Unborn.

And the couple sadly noted there was no ministry in the Philippines focused on saving the unborn.




Bro. Bo and the couple, along with supporters, were able to meet to discuss establishing such a ministry on May 8, 2009.

Long story short, Grace To Be Born was born on May 9, 2009. No doubt, Grace To be Born is God's Design. Because the following Sunday, May 10, happened to be Mother's Day—just the right day to give Grace as gift to the women the Ministry would hence take care of.





Grace To Be Born maintains a home for pregnant women in crisis, taking care of them throughout the nine months of their pregnancy in a Grace Home, providing board and lodging, medical care, and spiritual nourishment the mothers need to cope with their situation.

After giving birth to her baby, a mother may opt to bring home her baby. Or, for one reason or another, she may opt to leave the child in an orphanage which Grace maintains right in the Grace Home. Grace also has set up a foster care program which is duly recognized

by the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD).



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
