And by Divine Grace, Bro. Bo Sanchez, founder of the Light of Jesus, was led to put up a haven for abandoned elderly, calling the home *Anawim--* after the Hebrew word which means *God's poor*.

In December 1994, Anawim Lay Missions was born, putting up our Anawim Home for Abandoned Elderly.


We Are the Light

Fr. Joseph thanked sponsors, donors, and workers for their service: "You have made our elderly feel loved and accepted."


He pointed out: "Anawim is a fruit of God's love."

Yes, I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who remain in me, and I, in him, will produce much fruit. -- John 15:5


A Strong Branch

In these jobs, he developed various skills for his future life as caregiver. He was inspired to be a caregiver when he found his way to Anawim through his cousins Ryan Cruz, a volunteer caregiver in Anawim, and Jemalyn San Pascual, a nursing aid also in Anawim.

Eventually, Omar followed their footsteps. He studied Caregiving at Roosevelt Rodriguez, graduating in 2008. So, Anawim employed him as caregiver in the Nursing and Caregiving Services section.



Responsibilities

Omar is responsible for morning and evening care for the elderly. He assists in administering medicines such as oral, topical, and suppositories, accompanies patients to the hospital for check-up, treatment, or confinement.





Taking care of the well-being of the elderly, he makes sure they have proper hygiene, proper diet, and always exercise.

Omar is also responsible for proper monitoring and custody of elderly supplies as well as residential equipment, furniture, and fixtures assigned to him.

He enjoys helping the elderly house caretaker in decorating and maintaining the cleanliness and orderliness of elderly cottages as the need arises.

And he participates in teaching demonstration and supervision of student trainees assigned to his area of responsibility.

Now, married, Omar is grateful that his job helps him well to provide for his family. *Here*, Omar with wife Raziel and children Russel Andrei, Grade 8, and Luke Alessandrace, Grade 6.



A blessing he well appreciates is the Anawim Feast Light led by Feast Builder Bro. Hermie Morelos, held every Wednesday.

I decided not to get married and to this day, I enjoy my life as a bachelor. I wanted to be alone—but I would soon realize, all my life, I've never been alone.

I have had a string of jobs. But my income was not enough for my needs. So, I decided to work abroad. I was financially stable but still I felt lonely.

With that, I decided to come back home to the Philippines. I rented a house in Barangay San Rafael, Rodriguez, Rizal, and worked as a waiter at Harrison

Plaza Hotel. But the Coronavirus Disease (COVID) Pandemic happened in 2020, and the restaurant decided to lay off workers. Unfortunately, I was one of them.

I was able to survive because of my savings and my good neighbors helped provide for my needs. Also, I found a job as cook in a carinderia.

Then, in June 2023, I experienced a cloudy area in my eyes, later diagnosed as cataracts. A few months later, I could hardly see, so I decided to quit my job.

By God's amazing grace, one of the officials of Barangay San Rafael, Serafin 'Tatay Apen' Garibay, used to serve in Anawim Lay Mission Foundation Inc. He kindly referred me to Anawim. And Anawim admitted me on October 27, 2023.





In Anawim, I enjoy a secure life-a home in a comfortable cottage, plus medical care, giving me hope that I can see clearly again.

A priceless blessing is I feel the love of God through the unconditional caring of the Anawim leaders and personnel.

Here, I learned my favorite Bible verse, Romans 5:8: *But commandeth* his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.
